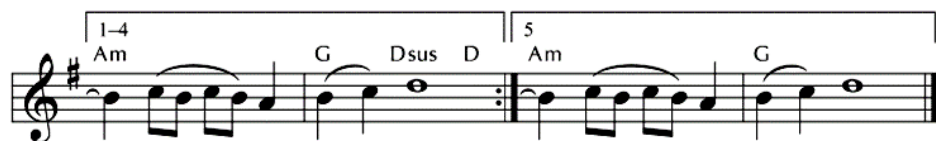



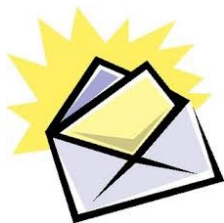




The Bulletin Board
